New Minibus Update

Early in 2020, we decided that our minibus would need replacing in the next couple of years or so. It was still going strong, was safe and passes it's MOT every year with flying colours, but due to its age it was becoming difficult to get spare parts and the bodywork was starting to go rusty in places. We estimated that a replacement second-hand vehicle would cost around £12-14,000. However, our plans had to be put on hold with the lockdown.

We're thrilled to be able to say that we now have $\pounds 6,000$ towards the new minibus. We received $\pounds 4,500$ from the Co-op due to the generosity of the customers, a wonderful donation of $\pounds 500$ from Romsley Parish Council and over $\pounds 900$ from Hillside Ladies' amazing Coffee morning. And we were delighted when we were



told that all the proceeds from The Sun's Monday Night Quiz are being donated towards the minibus.

We're well on our way to reaching our original target. However, since the pandemic, prices have become volatile. Also, the government are currently reviewing the legislation for minibuses which means we may be able to buy something better than originally intended. After Easter we should have a better idea of how much a replacement will cost. And we plan to apply to Trust Funds for grants when we know more accurately how much we need.

In the meantime, our current minibus is still going strong and is perfectly safe. But it is going to need replacing soon. So please remember The Sun's Quiz Night every Monday.

As you may know, we have 2 members of the Group who have been selected to go to the next World Jamboree in South Korea in July. Scout Alfie, and leader Emma, will be part of a contingent of 40 Scouts from West Mercia Scout County.

The World Jamboree is held every 4 years in a different country. It's larger than the Olympic Games with 40,000 Scouts from 196 countries taking part – the World's largest Youth Event.

The flight details have just been announced for the 3,500 Scouts going from the UK. Alfie and Emma will be flying to Seoul with Emirates Airlines from Heathrow, via Dubai. A great start to their Jamboree Experience.
